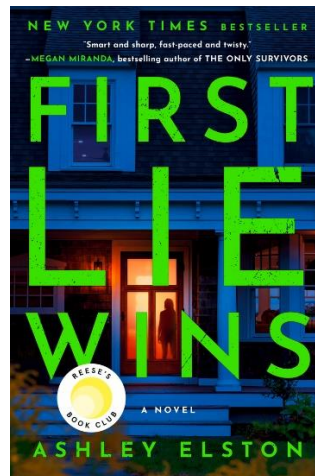
Library Hours Reminder
